



DNA UMPIRE ALLOCATION POLICY

Purpose

The purpose of having a Darwin Netball Association (DNA) Umpire Allocation Policy is to ensure that there is a difference between a DNA Umpire Allocation and a Club Umpire Allocation.

Process

In the first instance the Umpire Coordinator Convenor will endeavour to provide/allocate DNA umpires to cover all games.

DNA umpires are those umpires who have been nominated by clubs or those umpires identified as individual umpires who umpire on behalf of the DNA and not on behalf of their clubs.

Where the Umpire Coordinator Convenor cannot cover all games with DNA umpires, clubs will fill those umpiring commitments with their own club umpires.

The Umpire Coordinator Convenor will advise those clubs that are required to provide club umpires.

Consideration will be given to those clubs that have nominated umpires, as DNA umpires, in the allocation of club umpiring commitments.

Payment

During the season each club is charged \$20 per team per game. The DNA will invoice each club at the end of June and end of September.

During the season any allocated club umpire will be noted and the club will be paid \$15 per allocated club game which corresponds with the umpire sign in record (commitment sheet) at the end of the season.

All DNA umpires are to complete the DNA form detailing their bank details required. All DNA umpires are to fill in the Tax Hobby Form (available at the DNA office) and will be paid twice in the season (end of June and end of September).

All umpires, DNA and club are also required to sign the umpire commitment sheet prior to each game that they umpire. This commitment sheet is the record for the payments.

Clubs are charged \$20 per team per game for the Dry Season. DNA will subsidise the difference between umpire payment and club payment.

Umpires to be paid the following:

- A Badge \$35
- B Badge \$25
- C Badge- \$20
- Unbadged Senior \$15 (umpires/training umpires, who have passed Section 1 Theory exam and completed the on-line Level 1 course)

Example: Hoggies from 2015 – their total cost would be \$4,900 DNA would charge them \$4,400 (\$20/team) which means DNA subsidises \$500.

Forfeited Games – Prior Notice

When a club advises the DNA of a forfeit with prior notice, the DNA Allocated Umpire will not be paid for the game. The DNA Allocated Umpire is then able to be scheduled to a different game.

Forfeited Games – Same Day

When a club advises the DNA of a forfeit on the same day as game day, the DNA Allocated Umpire will be paid for the game even though the game did not occur unless allocated to a different game. The umpiring cost of the forfeited game will be paid by the forfeiting club.
