



COURT SUPERVISOR POLICY

Our commitment

The Darwin Netball Association (DNA) is committed to providing a safe environment for the participation of children and young people. Part of this is ensuring that children and young people are not left unsupervised while at the Netball NT facility.

When children are given access to facilities, operators assume a duty of care for them. The level of responsibility will vary depending on:

- If the child is alone and unsupervised.
- With parent/carer/guardian/family member.
- Attending an activity to watch their sibling play.
- Undertaking an activity at the facility.
- Attending a school group or club.
- Attending a public session.

For the purposes of this policy a child means a person under the age of 16 years.

The Role

- Ensures that spectators/supporters are not in breach of the Code of Conduct.
- Ensures there is no verbal abuse of Match Officials or players.
- Remove any person who does not comply with the directions issued to them by a Court Supervisor or the umpire. The offending person should be directed to leave the facility immediately.
- Will redirect non playing children away from potential or perceived risks.
