The DNA Management Office is located on the outdoor courts next to the food kiosk. There is a window access so that people can speak with the DNA volunteers if they have any issues.

When does the Darwin Netball Season commence?

Darwin Netball has two Seasons - Dry (competitive) and Wet (social).

The Dry Season Competition for Senior Womens and Senior Mens commences in March (Thursday nights) with time slots of 6:00pm, 7:30pm and 9:00pm. Juniors commences in April (Wednesday nights) with time slots from 5:00pm. Both competitions run until September with a break in the June/July school holidays. Preliminary, semi and grand finals held for both the Senior and Junior competitions.

Late January 2024, the DNA MT promotes and advises via email to Club Presidents, Facebook and Instagram will provide confirmation of the Dry Season start dates for both the senior and junior competitions.

The Wet Season Competition is a social eight week competition that runs from October – December on Thursday nights with time slots of 6:00pm, 7:00pm and 8:00pm. Teams provide their own umpires, scorers, balls and bibs. There are A Grade, B Grade, C Grade including mothers/daughters and mixed teams. There is no preliminary, semi or grand finals held.

Late September 2024, the DNA MT promotes and advises via email to Club Presidents, Facebook and Instagram will provide confirmation of the Wet season start date.

What are the DNA registration costs?

Netball NT charges the DNA for each player registration – for 2023 \$84.50 per senior player and \$69.41 per junior player. This cost is then incorporated into the DNA player registration fee. DNA always tries to limit the impact of the Netball NT fees and have for the past 10 years and have never passed on the full increase, unfortunately, for season 2023 DNA has had to increase due to Netball NT increasing the player registration and court hire fees.

Why isn't a whole of Season Draw sent out?

A whole of season draw is not sent out as there are usually multiple changes in the first half of the season due to team movements. To ensure that all senior teams have the opportunity to play at every timeslot the DNA extends every effort to ensure that the late timeslot is spread evenly across all teams in each Division.

The DNA promotes any changes via email to the clubs and on our Facebook page.

If one of your coaches notices some errors in the draw, please advise your club who will liaise with the DNA to review and rectify if required.

How do I register?

Netball Connect is the technology platform that has been adopted by Netball NT to provide the netball community with an efficient, user-friendly experience to manage, score, play and spectate. Netball Connect has a multitude of features including:

Registration: With the ability to register multiple competitions.

Game Day App: With real-time scoring, verification, recording and rostering, it aims

to reduce resources required for game day planning.

Competition Management: With the ability to reduce the time required for draws from weeks to

minutes.

Why do I pay a gate fee?

DNA asks you to pay a gate fee entry on game nights as the Territory Netball Stadium is managed and maintained by Netball NT.

Netball NT charge DNA a hire fee for using the indoor courts, outdoor courts, lights, electricity, air conditioning, water and ablutions.

Due to a lack of volunteers, the DNA has been required to employ casual staff in positions such as the Administration Officer and Match Day Supervisor. The gate fee is put towards funding these positions.

For 2023 Netball NT charges the DNA \$66 per hour per indoor court and \$38 per hour per outside court. The gate fee goes towards court hire, subsidising representative teams, development programs, NT Link teams, grand final medals/towels.

Children under the age of 16 years will be denied entry to the Territory Netball Stadium unless accompanied and supervised by an adult.

When and where are trainings?

Trainings are Monday and Tuesday evenings at Marrara Netball courts. Clubs arrange directly with Netball NT on the day and time. Clubs pay Netball NT directly for the cost of the use of the courts. Contact your club to find out what date and what time is relevant to you. Some clubs do train at different locations ie. Palmerston Netball Courts.

Club Presidents Meeting

To provide an opportunity for the DNA Management Team and Club Presidents to come together to collectively share/generate ideas/information and discuss different perspectives of issues that have arisen during the season competition. The meeting is to To improve and streamline the DNA competition by ensuring that all Clubs are aware and understand the requirements that the DNA competition is required to run within both Netball NT and Netball Australia's directions.

The DNA President is the Chair of the meeting. All DNA Management Team members attend the meeting.

Umpiring Committee

The Umpiring Committee is made up of badged umpires ranging from A to C and has well over 150 years of umpiring knowledge between the members and varying experience from National level to grass roots. Under the direction of the DNA Management Team the committee looks at streamlining the payment and allocation system regarding umpires across the DNA competition. It also facilitates and conducts information sessions throughout the season regarding rules, encouraging coaches, players and umpires to be a part of. A number of programs that are offered to identified umpires, providing umpires the chance to improve their skills in umpiring with the goal of achieving higher badges. Another element of this program is to ensure that there are mentors guiding those in the talent programs, and careful consideration is given when appointing mentors to the program.

The DNA Umpire Coordinator organises the umpire allocations each week. If the DNA umpires are unable to fill the umpiring slots, then the requests are sent to clubs to provide an umpire.

Code of Conduct

The DNA is committed to providing a safe environment for the participation and attendance of all people during the netball season. The DNA Management Team has a zero tolerance for bringing the DNA competition into disrepute with abusive (verbal and physical) and disrespectful behaviour. Please refer to the DNA Code of Conduct Offences Policy which applies to all registered members and non members of the DNA competition.

Umpiring issues during game days

If there is an issue in relation to umpiring or on court behavior during a match, a club member is able to come to the DNA Management Office and request that an Umpire Coordinator attend the match to supervise/review the situation.

All Abilities Netball Competition

The All Abilities Program is focused on providing more sporting and recreational opportunities for people living with a disability. The program usually runs for 10 weeks and involves games and skill sessions. This competition plays an important role in encouraging people in our community to engage in sporting activities which supports positive mental health and improves social skills along with promoting physical health.

No More Spirit Award for Premier League

The No More Spirit Award for Premier League is in relation to Charlie King's NO MORE Campaign and the NT News Sport. Each week the player that displays being the most supportive, has spirit, demonstrates sportsmanship at its highest level and behaviour towards umpires and opposition on court. The Premier League umpires vote for the two players on court that epitomizes the Spirit Award.

Non Playing Children in the Netball NT Facility

The DNA requires all clubs, parents, members and visitors to actively supervise their child/children at all times while present at the Netball NT Territory Netball Stadium.

Children are not allowed to run up and down the stairs in the indoor Territory Netball Stadium.

Please note that for the Junior Competition on Wednesday nights the DNA has employed a DNA Match Day Supervisor for the season. The DNA Match Day Supervisor will be on site each Wednesday to ensure that there is no untoward behaviour and that children are not left unsupervised and are redirected to their parents.

Social Media and Communication

We expect our members to conduct themselves appropriately when using electronic communication to share information with other members or posting material on public websites connected to the DNA.

Electronic communication:

- should be restricted to DNA matters
- must not offend, intimidate, humiliate or bully another person
- must not be misleading, false or injure the reputation of another person
- should respect and maintain the privacy of members
- not bring the DNA into disrepute.

Complaints Handled by On Court Umpires During a Match

If an incident form is completed in relation to an incident that occurred during a match where the On Court Umpires presided and a penalty was issued, the DNA considers that the matter has been resolved and finalised and will accept the complaint for information with no further action.

Complaints Handled by Club to Club

- On court unsportsmanlike behaviour.
- On court verbal inappropriate/offensive language.
- On court aggressive behaviour.
- Behaviour or an incident that occurred at the club level or involves people operating at the club level, the complaint is to be reported to and handled by the relevant club.

Complaints Handled by DNA

Incidents may occur before, during or after the conduct of the Tournament, Competition, Activity or Event and within the confines of the Marrara Netball NT Facility excluding the carpark and surrounds.

- · Abuse of an umpire.
- Gross breach of Code of Conduct.
- · Online breach of Code of Conduct.
- · Fighting.

- Spitting.

Where am able to walk on the inside courts?

When games are in play the umpires have absolute priority access to the outside of the court. During play you are required to walk 2 meters from the base line (goal posts). You are not permitted to walk in between courts at any time during play – only where the metal seats are located:


- between court 1 and 2
- between court 3 and 4
- against the wall on court 4

This is to ensure that umpires, players and spectators are not injured.

Red line indicates where you are unable to walk during play.

Yellow line indicates that you are able to walk during play as close to the wall and seating as possible.

Pink line indicates that you must walk as close as possible to the wall during play.



Where am able to walk on the outside courts?

When games are in play the umpires have absolute priority access to the outside of the court. During play you are required to walk 2 meters from the base line (goal posts). You are not permitted to walk in between courts at any time during play – only where the metal seats are located.

This is to ensure that umpires, players and spectators are not injured.

Red line indicates where you are unable to walk during play.

Yellow line indicates that you are able to walk during play.

Pink line indicates that you must walk as close as possible to the wire fence during play.
